Prospect and State of Transformation Movements of Marathi Language

Activity Report

Sant Ramdas College and Department of Marathi organised UGC sponsored two days national seminar on 13, 14 Feb. 2015. The seminar was inaugurated by renowed Marathi literateur and Vice chancellor, Dr. BAMU Aurangabad Dr. Nagnath Kotapalle. In his Inaugural speech he shed light on present education system and also appreciated the college and management for organizing the seminar. Hon. Shivajirao Chothe, president chaired the inauguration programme. In his presidential address he expressed his views on the state of education in rural and urban areas. Luminaries like Eknath Avad, Dr. Pralhad Lullekar were present on the stage. Principal Dr. R. K. Pardeshi in his introductory speech stressed the developments of the college.Dr. Pralhad Lullekar in his keynote address mentioned the history of transformation movements of Maharashtra ,its success and failure. Research scholars discussed various subjects in this regard. Six research scholars presented papers on prospects and state on transformation movements in British period. The session was chaired by Dr. Vinod Kumre of Mumbai University. He stated that Mahatma Phule's movements are the inspiration for the movements of this period.

After dinner poets from different areas presented their poems on rural, depressed, feminism and political consciousness themes.

In the third session of second day eight research scholars presented their papers on prospect and state of literary movement in post independence period. Dr. Sadashiv Sontakke chaired the session in which discussions were taken place on depressed class, feminism and tribal literature. True reflection of common man's life is reflected only in the literature of post- independence period. The gist of the discussion is the movements of this period inspired from equality, fraternity and justice.

Seven researchers presented papers on literary transformation movements after 1980. Research scholars focused on changing social and political life after 1980. Pandurang Kand from Pune presented

paper on muslim literary movements, Dr. Dilip Bhise's views on the nomadic literary movements were praiseworthy. The session was chaired by Dr. Prathviraj Taur from SRTMU Nanded who expressed his thoughts on human life in globalization and self centered mentality.
