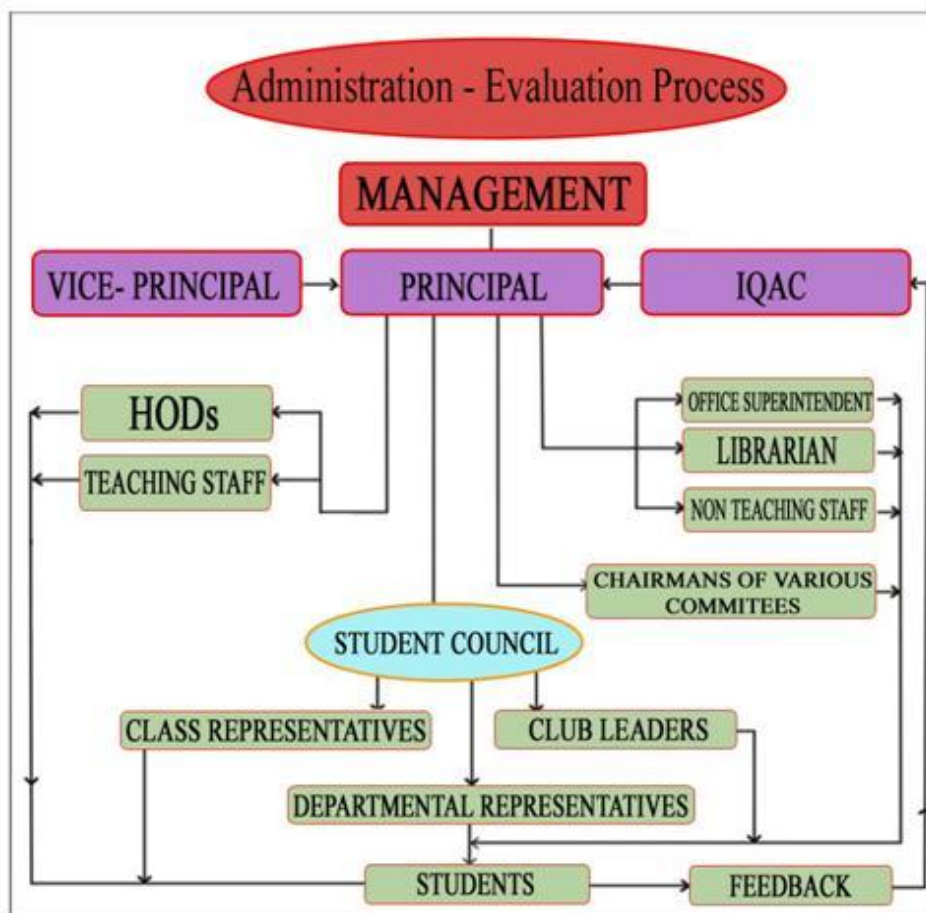

This practice has initiated in this context.

Practice

The green cover of the college is valued, protected and nurtured. The staff, students contribute in maintaining the trees and plants in the college. Students are encouraged to grow plants and trees and also enhanced their awareness, consciousness and knowledge about nature.

The practices like organic farming waste management, caring for flora and fauna, water and energy management. *sanitary and hygiene* campaigns and outreach programmes extending to neighbourhood schools and villages. The bonding between the college and the environment is not only manifest in activities and tasks undertaken by the college, but aims further to be internalized as a mode of being. The practice

The college has set up a library in an open space in college campus which is called open library. The college arranges sitting provision in open space for students and students use their spare time. It also helped in avoiding the overcrowd in library. Motivational and inspirational books are kept in the open library. The books have been selected very carefully. The selected books have been kept for seven days and then new books are provided by replacing earlier. The student's attendance is recorded in a record book. The interested students come and read the books as per their own choice. The students also get open option to select the book read as such.

Evidence of success

The success of this practice is not seen immediately but it can be gauged by the number of students who are enthusiastically reading new books. A feedback has been taken from the students who regularly used this library and come to know that they are benefited and get encouraged. Thus students spent their leisure time in reading books.

Because of the inadequate number of motivational and inspirational books it is difficult to replace books every month. Further, most of books are in English, hence, and students are from Marathi medium have problems to follow the content of the book
